






These pictures, taken in 2016, are of the Roman Forum. The Forum was a site located at the center of the ancient city of Rome and the location of important religious, political and social activities. It was a public meeting place for citizens, starting around 500 B.C. It is now a largely popular tourist site, as much of the buildings are still somewhat standing.

SATURN, THE TEMPLE OF
CASTOR AND POLLUX, THE
BASILICA, AND MOST NOTABLY,
THE COLOSSEUM.



THERE ARE WALLS WITH
INSCRIPTIONS IN LATIN TEXT
STILL STANDING, SUCH AS THIS
ONE. THESE WERE USED FOR
ANNOUNCEMENTS ABOUT
WHAT WAS HAPPENING AT THE
TIME, OR IMPORTANT MESSAGES
TO THE PUBLIC.

MOST OF THE ANCIENT
BUILDINGS IN THE
FORUM WERE DESTROYED
AROUND 410 A.D., WHEN
THE ROMAN EMPIRE FELL.
IT WAS THEN USED AS A
PASTURE FOR GRAZING
ANIMALS DURING THE
MIDDLE AGES, UNTIL IT
WAS DISCOVERED BY
ARCHAEOLOGISTS IN 1803.
